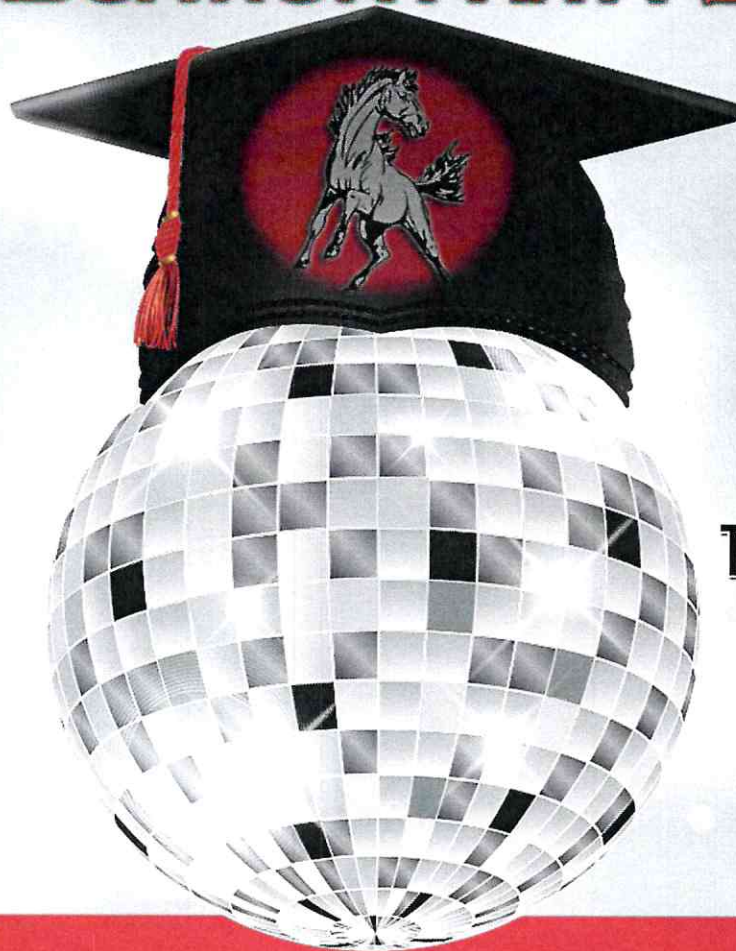

LPT 5.50.200.10 - NOISE ORDINANCE

LPT 5.50.200.10(a) - Excessive Noise Unlawful.

It is unlawful for any person to create noise or emit sound or cause the creation or emission thereof which is unreasonably loud, disturbing or unnecessary and is of such character, intensity or duration as to be detrimental to the life or health of any individual, or in disturbance of the public peace and welfare.

LPT 5.50.200.10(b) - Prohibited noise.

The following acts, among others, are declared to be loud, disturbing and unnecessary noises and as such are unlawful acts in violation of this chapter, but this enumeration shall not be deemed exclusive:

- A. The sounding of any horn or signal device on any automobile, van, truck, motorcycle, dirt bike or bus while in motion, except as a danger signal if another vehicle is approaching apparently out of control, or if in motion only as a danger signal after or as brakes are being applied and deceleration of the vehicle is intended; the creation by means of any such signal device or any unreasonably loud or harsh sound; and the sounding of such device for an unnecessary and unreasonable period of time;
- B. The playing of any radio or a musical instrument in such a manner or with such volume, particularly during the hours between eleven (11) p.m. and (8) a.m., as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of any persons in any office, hospital, dwelling, or other type of residence or of any persons in the vicinity;
- C. Yelling, shouting, hooting, whistling or singing on the public streets, particularly between the hours of eleven (11) p.m. and (8) a.m., or at any time or place so as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of any persons in any dwelling or any other type of residence or of any persons in the vicinity;
- D. The keeping of any animal, bird or fowl which by causing frequent or long continued noise shall disturb the comfort or repose of any person in the vicinity;
- E. The use of any automobile or motorcycle so out of repair, so loaded or in such manner as to cause loud and unnecessary grating, grinding, rattling or other noises;
- F. To discharge into the open air, a stationary internal combustion engine, motor vehicle, dirt bike or motor boat engine except through a muffler or other device which will effectively prevent loud or explosive noises therefrom;
- G. The erection, including excavation, demolition, alteration or repair of any building, streets and highways other than between the hours of (6) a.m. and (9) p.m. except in cases of urgent necessity in the interest of public health and safety and minor construction work not creating a noise disturbance in the neighborhood. If the building official should determine that the public

health and safety will not be impaired by the excavation, erection, demolition, alteration or repair of any building, street within the hours of (9) p.m. and (6) a.m., and if he shall further determine that loss or inconvenience would not result to any party in interest, he may grant permission for such work to be done between the hours of (9) p.m. and (8) a.m. upon request being made at the time a permit for the work is granted or during the progress of the work;

- H. The creation of any excessive noise on any street adjacent to any court while the same is in session, or adjacent to any hospital, which unreasonably interferes with the working or sessions thereof;
- I. The creation of a loud and excessive noise in connection with loading or unloading any vehicle or the opening and destruction of bales, boxes, crates and containers;
- J. The use or operation of a loudspeaker or sound amplification device in connection with any radio, tape recorder, microphone or other devices in which the emanated sounds are of such a strength, character, intensity or duration as to be a public nuisance, cause interference with pedestrian or vehicular traffic, be detrimental to the life or health of any individual or be in disturbance of the public peace and welfare;
- K. Exceptions. None of the terms or prohibitions of this chapter shall apply to or be enforced against:
 - 1. Any vehicle of the Tribe while engaged upon necessary public business,
 - 2. Excavations or repairs of streets by or on behalf of the Lovelock Paiute Tribe, or the state of Nevada, during the night, when the public welfare and convenience renders it impracticable to perform such work during the day,

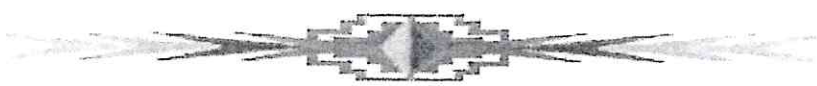
LPT 5.50.200.10(c) - Variances and fees.

The Tribal Council may grant variances from the strict application of this chapter to allow reasonable activities not deleterious to the public welfare to be conducted where extraordinary circumstances exist due to the unique characteristics of the activity and surrounding neighborhood.

- A. More than thirty (30) days in advance of a proposed activity and upon payment of a twenty-five-dollar (\$25.00) fee, application may be made to the Tribal Administrator for a variance from the provisions of this chapter. The application must be subscribed by the property owner where the proposed activity is stationary. The responsible person or promoter of a nonstationary activity must subscribe the application.
- B. The Tribal Administrator shall set a date with the Tribal Council for a public hearing on the variance request between fifteen (15) and thirty (30) days after receipt of the application. Notice of the hearing shall be posted at the Tribal Administration at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing date which shall contain a general description of the proposed activity and location.
- C. The Tribal Council shall render a decision upon the application within fifteen (15) days of the hearing and failing such the application shall be deemed approved. The decision shall contain a finding of facts expressing the existence of extraordinary circumstances and unique characteristics of the activity and surrounding neighborhood which will not jeopardize the public welfare.

LPT 5.50.200.10(d) - Violation—Penalty.

Any person found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall pay a fine for the first offense in the amount of \$100.00. The second offense in the amount of \$200.00 and any additional violations will be in increments of \$100.00 up to \$1,000.00, maximum penalty.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE LOVELOCK PAIUTE
TRIBE TO APPROVE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF A NOISE ORDINANCE
LPT 5-50-200.10 TO THE LOVELOCK TRIBAL ORDINANCE**

resolution #: 20-LPT-8

WHEREAS, The Lovelock Paiute Tribe is organized pursuant to the provisions of Section 16 of the Indian reorganization Act of 1934 (48 Stat. 984) as amended by the Act of June 15, 1935 (49 Stat. 379) and is a federally recognized Tribe, and

WHEREAS, The Lovelock Tribal Council has the authority and responsibility to exercise the privileged and powers of self-government to establish policies and procedures in behalf of and to protect the general health and welfare of the Tribal Members, and

WHEREAS, The Lovelock Paiute Tribe has determined the need of approving and implementing a Noise Ordinance Declaration Order, LPT 5-50-200.10, The Tribal Council may enact a Noise Ordinance for public safety and quality of life. Effective immediately, a Noise Ordinance has been enacted from 11 p.m. to 8 a.m. for adults and juveniles. It is unlawful for any person to create noise or emit sound or cause the creation or emission thereof which is unreasonably loud, disturbing or unnecessary and is of such character, intensity or duration as to be detrimental to the life or health of any individual, or in disturbance of the public peace and welfare. Any person found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall pay a fine for the first offense in the amount of \$100.00. The second offense in the amount of \$200.00 and any additional violations will be in increments of \$100.00 up to \$1,000.00, maximum penalty.

WHEREAS, The Lovelock Tribal Council is empowered under Article 6, Section 1(h), of the Constitution and Bylaws to enact ordinances to protect the health and welfare of the members of the Tribe, and for other purposes considered in the best interest of the Tribe, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), Western Nevada (WNA) review and follow through with the



Lovelock Paiute Tribe's desire in approving a Noise Ordinance LPT 5.50.200.10.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the BIA-WNA contact the Lovelock Paiute Tribe once this ordinance is approved at the Secretary of Interior's Office.

CERTIFICATION

It is hereby certified that the Lovelock Tribal Council is the governing body of the Lovelock Paiute Tribe, composed of four (4) members of whom 3 constitutes a quorum, were present at a duly held meeting on the 7 day of July, 2020, and the foregoing resolution was adopted by the affirmative vote of 4 FOR, 0 AGAINST AND 0 ABSTENTIONS, and that said resolution has not been rescinded nor amended in any way.

Reminder of Van Rules

The Lovelock Paiute Tribal Transportation Policy states that each patient may have no more than 6 cancelations. Cancellation consists of canceling, rescheduling, missing appointments or a no show.

*The Lovelock Paiute Tribal Transportation services does their best to make sure everyone gets to their appointments. Health is important.

The policy states:

No more than 6 appointments may be missed, canceled, or rescheduled in a six months' time.

If you miss, cancel, or reschedule 6 appointments, you van privileges will be revoked for 3 months. After 3 months off the van, you will then have 3 months to attend your appointments. If you miss 3 appointments in that 3-month time frame, then your privileges will remain revoked until the year is up. If you progress and keep your appointments in those 3 months, then you will be accepted back with regular van privileges.

You may have a copy of a policy upon request.

TO ALL PATIENTS THAT RIDE THE LPT VAN

***Transportation to and from medical appointments is a privilege and can be revoked at any time for any abusive or inappropriate behavior.**

***All passengers are forbidden to use tobacco, vapes, alcohol or any illegal substances on or during transport.**

***Inebriated persons will not be allowed to be transported at any time.**

***Excessive client cancellations and or no-shows may result in the loss of transportation privileges.**

***All children that ride with their parent or legal guardian must go into the appointment with that adult. The driver is not responsible to watch the child for any time.**

***Patients must obey the law and wear their seatbelts. Child must be restrained in an appropriate car seat for their size, weight, and age, and always buckled.**

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

***Inebriated means: an intoxicated person. This can be from alcohol or drugs of any kind.**

***Intoxicated means: affected by a substance that intoxicates; drunk; inebriated. Alcohol or drug causing a person to lose control of their behavior.**

***Intoxicate means: to affect temporarily with diminished physical and mental control by means of alcoholic liquor, a drug (including prescription), or other substance.**

All dogs and cats should have their first rabies vaccination at 3 months (12 weeks) old, followed by a booster shot within the first year. Thereafter, they should be vaccinated every three years. Please bring your pet's most recent vaccination records with you, if possible.

Pet owners are responsible for their pets during the rabies clinic. A cat in a cage, burlap bag, or pillowcase, is much easier to handle. Dogs should be leashed at all times during the clinic. Animals that cannot be controlled by the owner, or that pose a safety risk, will not be served.
