Dear Tribal Community:

*Letter from Lacey Donaldson, Pershing County Clerk-Treasurer:

All registered voters will be receiving a ballot in the mail. The voter has the option to vote that ballot or vote in person at a polling place.

I have ordered an indoor/outdoor ballot box to be placed at the Tribal Administration Building throughout Early Voting and on Election Day. During Early Voting, drop-off would be available during the hours your Admin staff is there. If you would like drop-off to be available on Election Day, someone would have to man the box from 7:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. Someone from my staff would collect the ballots throughout Early Voting and on Election Day.

In-Person Early Voting is held at the Pershing County Administration Building across the street from the Post Office. The permanent Election Day polling place for Pershing County is located at the Lovelock Community Center, which is approximately 0.2 miles from the Tribal Administration Building. Pershing County has limited resources and it is not financially or logistically feasible to establish another in-person polling location given the proximity.

If anyone is interested in becoming a pole worker, please let me know so I can get you in contact with the Clerk-Treasures office.

Please remember this is for Local, state, and federal elections. NOT TRIBAL ELECTIONS.

I will have more information for the community, the closer we get to the start of the election process. If you have any questions or concerns, please let me know. My contact information is included above.

Dear Lovelock Paiute Tribal Members and Residents,

This letter is a notification of NV Energy's planned maintenance of the overhead electrical lines and replacement of poles along Jamestown Avenue and the north side of the Tribe's property on Sawabe Drive in Lovelock, Nevada. The existing electrical line and 8 wood poles will be replaced with new steel poles to improve reliability and increase fire protection for the customers of Lovelock, including the Tribe. Many of these structures are over 50 years old and have deteriorated therefore requiring the maintenance as described.

NV Energy plans to begin the improvement activities in late 2022. The existing roads will be used for staging of equipment and transporting of materials. The work will include the removal and replacement of the electrical lines and poles, one foundation, and all maintenance activities will be contained within the existing roadway footprint and no other disturbance will take place.

All motorized vehicles and equipment will be equipped with Fire Prevention and Suppression Equipment and personal safety equipment as required.

When my office is notified of the exact dates, we will let the community know. At this time the dates are still to be determined. If you have any questions, please contact my office. 775-273-7861 ext. 15.

The Head Start program is administered by the Administration for Children and Families (ACF) in the Department of Health and Human Services. The purpose is to promote the school readiness of low-income children by enhancing their cognitive, social, and emotional development; 1) in a learning environment that supports children's growth in language, literacy, mathematics, science, social and emotional functioning, creative arts, physical skills, and approaches to learning; and 2) through the provision to low-income children and their families of health, educational, nutritional, social, and other services that are determined, based on family needs assessments.

What can Head Start offer my child?

- Helps children grow educationally, socially, physically, and emotionally.
- Children socialize with others, solve problems, and have other experiences which help them become self confident.
- Free, nutritious meals are provided.
- Vision, hearing, physical, dental, and nutritional assessments will be completed on your child.
- Mental Health and other services are available for children and families with disabilities.
- Head Start provides children with Kindergarten readiness skills.



Eligibility Requirements

- **Age**- Child must be 3 or 4 years old.
- **Income**- Family must meet federal poverty income guidelines. However, we accept up to 49% of over income families.
- **Disabilities**- at least 10% of the total number of enrollment opportunities must be made available for children with disabilities.



Required Documentation

- Completed Head Start Application
- Copy of Child's Birth Certificate
- Copy of Child's Current Immunization Record
- Proof of Income (12 months family income)



Selection Criteria

6 Points	Income Eligible 4 Year Old Public Assistance: SSI/TANF Child in Foster Care Homelessness
5 Points	Native American Priority Target Area-Reservation/Colony, or is Native to the Reservation
4 Points	Diagnosed Disability 3 Year Old
3 Points	At Risk Family; Single Parent, or Child is in the Care of Grandparents / Other Family Members
2 Points	Non-Native Child Returning Child Documentation of Legal Guardianship
1 Point Negative Points	Sibling in the Program Over income points are deducted or added according to the current income guidelines

Membership includes Doctors, Dentists, and other health personnel. Members participate in the planning, operation, & evaluation of the Health Services offered by Head Start.

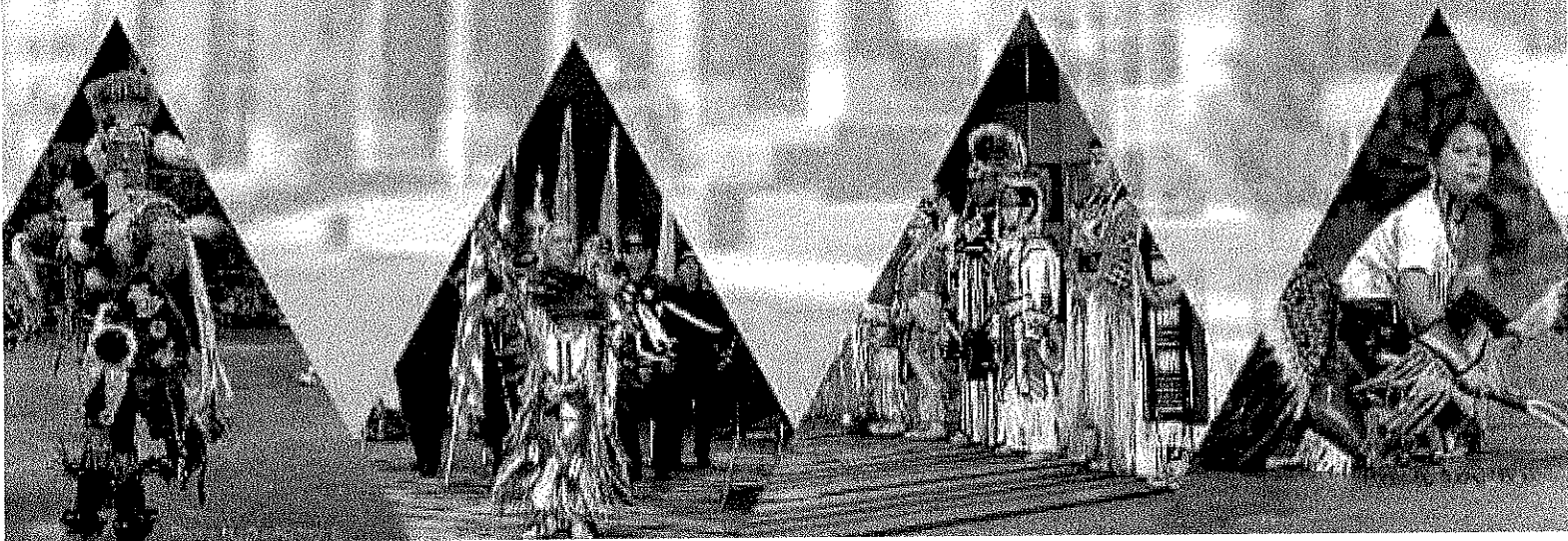

2022 NATIONAL WEEK OF ACTION FOR MMIW

Schedule of Events

The National Partners Work Group on Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women (MMIW) and the MMIW Family Advisors are organizing a National Week of Action (April 29-May 5, 2022) to call the nation and the world to action in honor of missing and murdered Indigenous women.
